

The Mass in Slow Motion, Continued... The Liturgy of the Word

Let's continue taking a look at the Mass, as we have in past weeks. Today's focus is on the first main part of Mass, known as the Liturgy of the Word, or more simply as "the readings."

The Liturgy of the Word has a long and storied history, but in its current form, it consists of four parts: an Old Testament reading, a Psalm, a New Testament reading, and a Gospel reading. Through these readings, explained by the homily, God speaks his message to his people and nourishes their spirit.

The Liturgy of the Word has its origin in the Jewish synagogue. In the first century, there were two readings each sabbath. The first was from the Law (the first five books of the Bible) and was read according to a three-year cycle. The second reading was from the books of the Prophets. The very first Christians attended the Saturday synagogue service, and then celebrated the Eucharist in a private home on Sunday. Before long, Christians were expelled from synagogues and took the synagogue reading-service with them, combining it with the celebration of the Eucharist. Can you see how the Mass of today took its present form, based on this?

Over the years, the arrangement of the synagogue service was adapted to Catholic prayer. A Gospel reading was added, and over time, the Old Testament passage was chosen to echo the theme of the Gospel. Listen carefully to the first reading and the Gospel each week, and you will hear how they are very similar. The second reading is independent of the other readings, and allows the priest a bit more source material from which to draw a homily, if he needs to.

Today, we take the readings each Sunday from a book called the Lectionary. Just as in the ancient synagogue days, the Lectionary provides for a three-year cycle for the Sunday readings—known as Year A, Year B, and Year C—and a two-year cycle for weekdays—known as Year I, and Year II. Each year, we focus especially on one of the Gospels. Year A focuses on the Gospel of St. Matthew; Year B focuses on the Gospel of St. Mark; and Year C focuses on the Gospel of St. Luke. All three of the cycles draw on the Gospel of St. John. The weekdays draw from all the Gospels and books of the Bible, giving special emphasis to passages not covered on Sundays. If you were to attend Mass every day for three years, hearing all Sunday and weekday reading cycles, you would hear virtually the entire Bible proclaimed.

Next time, we will focus on one of the most misunderstood and under-appreciated parts of the Mass: the Responsorial Psalm.

Is Paul serious? Can you imagine being content with "weaknesses, insults, hardships, and persecutions?" (2Cor 12:10) Paul could have been proud of all that God revealed to him, and of all that he accomplished in spreading the gospel. But instead he boasts about his weaknesses. He knows that all the good work he has done have been accomplished by Christ. So he accepted suffering, rejection, setbacks and persecution because they helped him see how much Christ was doing through him.

We can learn a lot from St. Paul. Re-

member how Jesus said to love your neighbor as yourself. Paul loved himself in the good sense of accepting his faults and weaknesses. He was always aware that he once persecuted Christians. But that fault enabled him to experience God's forgiveness.

St. Paul says that when he is weak, then he is strong. He knows that God will still work through him, showing God's power to heal the sick and draw converts to Christ, in spite of Paul's weaknesses. Paul did what he could to encourage others to follow Jesus, but he knew the results of his preach-

ing and healing were up to God. When you think that you would fail at spreading the faith, remember Paul and give your weaknesses to God. Then see what he can do!




