Four Steps to Becoming a Peacemaker

"Blessed are the peacemakers, for they shall be called the children of God," (Mt 5:9).

Establish peace within yourself

We cannot give what we do not have. If we're not at peace within ourselves, we cannot give peace to anyone else. St. Augustine once said, "peace is the tranquility of order." That means peace within ourselves comes from right order within our own souls. It may not be a popular idea at this moment in history, but we can't have right order within our souls unless we are humble, docile, and obedient to Christ. That means to love God's word, to love the teachings of the Church, to make a good confession on a regular basis, to keep the commandments, and to strive to life a selfless life. First, be at peace with God. Then we will be able to give peace to others.

Be patient with the faults of others

Don't expect to live in peace with others if you're incessantly demanding and intolerant of their personal faults. Most fights begin with someone's unreasonable expectations. If we are constantly agitated at someone's weaknesses, or if we demand from others what they're not strong enough to accomplish, we always spark conflict. Notice how gentle Jesus was with those who were weak, sinful, and ignorant of their faults. To become a peacemaker, we must imitate his patience. That's one personal change worth making. There's an old saying that goes, "It's better to put on slippers than to try to carpet the entire world."

Correct When You Must

There is no peace without justice. Sometimes, justice requires a confrontation. Although we should be patient with another's personal faults, we must draw the line when someone's life, health, or safety are at risk. There are also times when someone we love is risking the loss of their soul with unrepented serious sin. In such circumstances, Christlike charity requires us to speak out. At this hour in history, we live with the false idea that "love" means "unconditional approval" of someone else's behavior, regardless of its consequences. But true love wants the ultimate good of another person. St. Thomas Aquinas once said that to rid someone of evil is the same as to do him good. Sometimes, the first step to peacemaking is the resolve to establish justice, even at the price of confrontation.

Forgive

Forgiveness is usually misunderstood. People think forgiveness means "not having negative feelings" about another person. But forgiveness is not a feeling. It's a decision. Forgiveness is the choice not to think, speak, or act with resentment against another person. Effectively, forgiveness says, "I do not hold this offense against you." There are three reasons why God asks us to forgive. 1) Forgiveness is the only antidote to bitterness. Unforgiveness is when an innocent person punishes himself for the crime of the guilty. 2) Our forgiveness sets others free. Most everyone with a conscience feels badly for their wrongdoing, and wants to be forgiven. Forgiveness is one way to "do unto others" as we wish to have done unto ourselves. 3) Forgiveness is the most perfect imitation of Christ himself. Please remember, forgiving doesn't mean you've forgotten. It doesn't mean you've re-established trust. It just means, "I do not hold this against you." That's just what we want God to say to us one day, isn't it?




