### A "Cheat Sheet" on Ecclesiastical Ranks

(In response to a question from a parishioner)

Our church has a hierarchy of three ranks: deacon, priest, and bishop. But what about all the other "ranks" of clergy out there? Archbishop? Cardinal? Monsignor? There exists a bewildering strata of ranks within the church hierarchy, but a very simple ordering, from lowest to highest, looks like this:

**Deacon:** According to our catechism, deacons are ordained "not to the priesthood, but to the ministry." Deacons are tasked with assisting bishops and priests in the service of a parish. A deacon answers to a pastor.

**Parochial Vicar:** A priest assigned by the bishop to be a co-worker with a pastor in the service of a parish. A parochial vicar answers to a pastor.

**Parochial Administrator:** A priest assigned by the bishop to direct a parish, with the same duties as a pastor, but with limited authority. Bishops appoint administrators to test their suitability for the role of pastor. A parochial administrator answers to a bishop.

**Pastor:** A priest appointed by the bishop to be the "proper shepherd" of a parish, who exercises authority as an extension of the bishop, and in cooperation with him. A pastor answers to a bishop.

**Dean:** A priest appointed by the bishop to coordinate and promote pastoral activity among a grouping of several parishes, known as a "deanery." A dean answers to a bishop.

**Auxiliary Bishop:** An additional bishop assigned by the pope to a diocese so extensive that it requires more than one bishop to administer. An auxiliary bishop answers to the pope.

**Bishop:** An ordained minister who has the fullness of the priesthood, and acts as a successor to the apostles. A bishop is the "proper shepherd" of an entire diocese. A bishop answers to the pope.

**Archbishop:** A bishop who governs an "archdiocese." An archdiocese is a diocese that is either heavily populated, geographically vast, or historically important. An archbishop answers to the pope.

**Metropolitan:** A bishop who has oversight, but not authority, over a grouping of dioceses known as an "ecclesiastical province." A metropolitan answers to the pope.

**Cardinal:** A bishop, personally chosen by the pope, to serve as a papal advisor and as a potential elector of a new pope. A cardinal answers to the pope.

**Primate:** Found only in older Catholic countries, a primate is a title that gives "primacy" to an archbishop. It once carried special authority, such as the right to crown the sovereign, but is now purely honorific. A primate answers to the pope.

**Patriarch:** A term with more meaning in the Eastern Rites of the Catholic Church than in the Latin Rite. Eastern Rite Patriarchs have authority and jurisdiction over all the dioceses in their church, yet are still in union with the pope. **Pope:** The Bishop of Rome, the successor of St. Peter, the Vicar of Christ, and the Servant of the Servants of God, the pope shepherds the entire church, just as Jesus did, until he comes again. The pope answers to God!

**...What about "monsignor?"** "Monsignor" is not a rank, but an honor bestowed on a priest by the pope. There really isn't any difference between a monsignor and a priest...but don't say that to a monsignor!

God bless you...and St. Theresa, pray for us!

**now open**: The St. Theresa CYO Basketball program follows the guidelines established by the NVJCYO. It is open to all students currently enrolled in St. Theresa School or the St. Theresa Church Religious Education program in grades 4-8. The program is always looking for volunteers. All coaches & volunteers must comply with the Arlington Diocese Child Protection Program. Registration for the 2023-2024 season opened on **October 6, 2023**. Registration will close on October 26, 2023. Cost is \$100 to join a team. Practices should begin on or about November 6, 2023 – by then teams should be formed (enough players registered and a coach identified). Your child's coach will contact you with specifics. Practice times are determined by gym space availability and the coach's availability. Practices are generally 60 minutes, twice a week. Information about games can be found at the Arlington Diocese Website. Games should begin December 2nd and are played at gyms throughout the Diocese of Arlington. Venues are determined based on availability. Uniforms are not part of the registration fee and will be handled once practices begin.

## How to Register to be a Parishioner of St. Theresa Catholic Church

In the sacramental life of the Church, Catholic faithful will need to prove residency in a parish. Registration with the parish office allows us to track your sacramental data and keep you connected with the life of the church.

In order to register, come to the parish office Monday -Friday 9:30am – 3:30pm to fill out a registration card. Yellow registration cards can also be obtained at all of the Church entrances - these can be mailed to the parish or given to an usher during a church liturgy.

Assistive Listening Devices. Did you What are the Crosses outside? know one out of every 8 adults in the U. S. has some difficulty hearing even when using a hearing aid? That means that on any given weekend, hundreds of our congregation are missing much of what is being said at Mass. To help them, St. Theresa's has an assistive listening system in the church that can be accessed by wearing compatible headphones (or an earpiece) with a receiver that amplifies the voices heard over the sound system. A neck loop is also available for people who have hearing aids or cochlear implants with the telecoil (t-coil) function. These assisted listening devices can be checked out from an usher before Mass. Talk with an usher for more information.
