Everyone's Irish on March 17

Today's saint is the beloved St. Patrick. Most people think of St. Patrick's Day simply as a day to wear green, but do you know about the real St. Patrick? Here's a quick biography:

387 AD—St. Patrick is born in Scotland (the Roman province of *Britannia*) of Roman-British parents. His baptismal name is Maewyn Succat. He would not take the name Patrick until his ordination to the priesthood nearly thirty years later.

403 AD—Sixteen year old Patrick is captured by Irish pirates and sold as a slave. An irreligious and spiritually indifferent boy, Patrick turns to God in desperation. He develops a deep, mature faith in the midst of his sufferings.

409 AD—In a dream, God tells Patrick to flee to the seacoast where he will discover a ship bound for Britain. He does so, and with his newfound freedom, immediately begins studies for the priesthood.

432 AD—Patrick is ordained a bishop, and asks to return to Ireland. He begins a thirty-year project of converting the Irish people to Christianity.

466 AD—Patrick dies on March 17. His mortal remains are laid to rest in Downpatrick near Belfast, with St. Brigid and St. Columba.

Many legends have grown up surrounding St. Patrick. Some are true—he did in fact preach the message of the Trinity using a shamrock. Some are false—he never drove the snakes out of Ireland (taxonomists believe Ireland never had snakes in the first place). But St. Patrick's greatest legacy is the example of his life.

Who else but a saint would choose to return to the land of his oppression and slavery, motivated not by hatred or vengeance, but to teach the beauty of the Gospel? Who else but a saint would draw such good out of evil, imitating the example of Christ himself? As St. Patrick wrote:

[In Ireland] the Lord had regard for my abjection, and mercy on my youth and ignorance, and watched over me before I knew Him. And before I was able to distinguish between good and evil, He guarded me and comforted me as would a father his son. (The Confession of St. Patrick)

In his Epistle to the Romans, St. Paul says that God makes all things work for the good of those who love Him. St. Patrick's unique example of love places him among the heroes of the faith. May the example of St. Patrick can inspire us to believe that God's grace flows most abundantly in times of suffering, helping us to do the most important work of all—drawing good out of evil, for the love of our neighbor and the glory of God.

God bless you, and St. Theresa (and St. Patrick), pray for us!
