About Exorcisms

Your priests regularly receive questions on the topics of demonic activity, possession, and exorcisms. Without giving this topic any more attention than it deserves, I thought it might be helpful to answer some of the most common questions here.

Are Exorcisms real? Is this part of the Catholic faith?

In short, yes. The best reference for this is the Catechism of the Catholic Church:

When the Church asks publicly and authoritatively in the name of Jesus Christ that a person or object be protected against the power of the Evil One and withdrawn from his dominion, it is called exorcism. Jesus performed exorcisms and from him the Church has received the power and office of exorcizing. In a simple form, exorcism is performed at the celebration of Baptism. The solemn exorcism, called "a major exorcism," can be performed only by a priest and with the permission of the bishop. The priest must proceed with prudence, strictly observing the rules established by the Church. Exorcism is directed at the expulsion of demons or to the liberation from demonic possession through the spiritual authority which Jesus entrusted to his Church. Illness, especially psychological illness, is a very different matter; treating this is the concern of medical science. Therefore, before an exorcism is performed, it is important to ascertain that one is dealing with the presence of the Evil One, and not an illness. (CCC 1673)

Does the Diocese of Arlington have an exorcist?

The Bishop has assigned three priests with the task of exorcism in the Diocese of Arlington, but their identities are kept confidential to protect them from any unnecessary attention.

Have you ever performed an exorcism?

No.

Do our priests receive any training in exorcism?

Not unless they are asked by the Bishop to do so. However, in 2010, all the priests of the Diocese attended a three-day seminar led by the exorcist of the Archdiocese of Chicago. He advised us to share the following information with our parishioners who wish to grow in holiness, or who may be experiencing any kind of demonic attack:

- Regularly attend Mass, and receive Holy Communion.
- Seek out a regular confessor for the Sacrament of Penance.
- Spend time in adoration before the Blessed Sacrament.
- Incorporate Marian devotions into your daily routine, especially the Rosary.
- Use Scripture for prayer and reflection, especially the prologue of John's Gospel.
- Include other devotions, especially the Divine Mercy, and prayers to patron saints, into your daily prayer routine.
- Use sacramentals such as holy water, blessed salt, and other blessed objects.
- Seek to use the traditional channels of God's healing and grace, as opposed to seeking out extraordinary things, such as exorcisms.
- There is no magic bullet or quick fix for overcoming the assaults of the Devil. Like all of the spiritual life, it is a journey.
- Above all, remain focused on Jesus Christ—not on the Devil, or evil, despite the evil one's attempts to the contrary.

God bless you, and St. Theresa, pray for us!


