### **My Heart Breaks Every Week**

My heart breaks every time I see someone leave Mass right after receiving communion. (Yes, your priest can see you leaving.) It's a problem not unique to St. Theresa. In virtually every Catholic parish in the world, a substantial number of people receive the Eucharist, then immediately walk out the door. I've never spoken or written about this before, because in the grand scheme of things, it seems to be a triviality...a first-world problem...a molehill. Although admittedly it's not the grandest problem in the Church, it still deserves mention.

Many people who leave Mass early will tell the priest, "You should just be grateful that I came—at 'least' I was here!" Your priest would reply, "My gratitude to you does not matter. What matters is your gratitude to God. The Mass is the worship of God, and worship never means giving God your 'least.' God deserves your best."

The Mass is the "source and summit of the Christian life." (CCC 1324) It is the re-presentation of Calvary, the one holy sacrifice of Our Lord Jesus Christ. The Eucharist is Jesus Christ himself, really, truly, and substantially present. Mass is the most important thing you do all week. That is never something to minimize.

Quite simply, at the time of distribution of the Eucharist, the Mass is not yet finished. When people leave early, they willfully neglect the opportunity to pray after receiving communion, and they willfully neglect the final blessing. Would you ever accept an invitation to dinner, then walk out the door before dinner is even finished? If you did, wouldn't you deeply insult the host and all the other dinner guests? Yet this is exactly what people do every time they leave Mass early.

Some people will reply, "But what if I have a really good reason to leave early? What if an emergency suddenly came up?" Then, for goodness sakes, leave as soon as you know of the emergency. Don't even stay until communion. Honestly though, the vast majority of Catholics who leave Mass early are not leaving because of an emergency. They are leaving early because they want to beat the traffic. Leaving early has become their habit. They've never been corrected or told that their behavior is sinful, which it is.

If God is the deepest love of your heart, how could you ever willfully choose to cut corners with him in your prayer, especially at Mass? Spiritual mediocrity is not something we should tolerate, much less freely choose on a regular basis. Some will say, "I was once taught that we only have to be at Mass from the Gospel reading through communion." Your priest would reply—that's never been true. It's written nowhere—not in Canon Law, or the General Instruction of the Roman Missal, or any other Church document. To attend Mass means to attend all of Mass.

Occasionally, someone may get stuck in traffic, or delayed against their will, and arrive at Mass late. (Arriving deliberately late and regularly late—that's the subject of another discussion!) That's far more common, and more forgivable. Leaving Mass early though is quite deliberate, and entirely different. The bottom line is this: attending Mass means staying until the very end. If you've been in the habit of leaving Mass early, please stop. God is worth it.

God bless you...and St. Theresa, pray for us!

#### **Sponsor Certificates**

Please contact the Parish Office to obtain a sponsor certificate prior to a Baptism or Confirmation.

#### **Baptisms**

Parents desiring Baptism for their child must attend a class (preferably before the child's birth) held the first Thursday of each month at **7pm (note the** time change) in a Conference Room in the Administration Bldg. You may schedule your child for the Sacrament of Baptism (held all Sundays 1:30pm) by visiting the Parish website under Faith, Sacraments, Baptism. Date is confirmed once all paperwork is received in the office (at least 2 weeks prior to the date of desired Baptism.)

#### Matrimony

The priest must be contacted at least six (6) months prior to the wedding date.

Visit the Parish Website under Faith, Sacraments, Marriage and fill out the Marriage Preparation Questionnaire prior to contacting the Parish Office. A priest will contact you.

#### RCIA

Adults desiring instruction in the Catholic Faith should visit the website to register for RCIA classes.

#### Hospitalized/Homebound

Please contact the Parish Office to ask for Holy Communion or the Anointing of the Sick.
