### Why Did We Veil the Statues?

Why are all of the statues covered in purple cloth? Even the crucifix is covered. Shouldn't we all be looking at the crucifix while we listen to the Passion narrative on Palm Sunday? There are four reasons we veil the statues:

First: The Church encourages it. The Roman Missal states, "In the Dioceses of the United States, the practice of covering crosses and images throughout the church from this [the fifth] Sunday [of Lent] may be observed. Crosses remain covered until the end of the Celebration of the Lord's Passion on Good Friday, but images remain covered until the beginning of the Easter Vigil."

Second: The fact that the statues are veiled immediately grabs your mind's attention. One cannot help but think, "This is very different. What's the explanation?" The church does look different because these final days of Lent are special, and the veils make that difference visible. The final two weeks of Lent are meant to heighten your awareness of the upcoming Triduum (Holy Thursday, Good Friday, Holy Saturday) which is the most sacred time of the year.

Third: The veiled images are meant to be a subtle suggestion that, for now, we should pay extra-close attention to what is not veiled, namely the spoken word at the pulpit and the Eucharist at the altar. Nothing is wrong with statues, but the last days of Lent are supposed to ask of us an even deeper focus on the two basic elements of prayer at Mass.

Finally: The Church uses these veils to heighten your anticipation for Easter. You don't want to see those veils there. "Get them off," you imagine to yourself, "it's unnatural for those statues to be covered." Believe it or not, that instinct is one of the main reasons the veils are there in the first place. The statues are meant to be unveiled, and Easter is when all will finally be set right.

The unveiling at Easter is a great reminder of the truth of our own lives on earth. We live in a "veiled" world, in exile from heaven, our true home. It is only through death (Good Friday) that the veil is finally lifted and at last we come to heaven (Easter Sunday), the land of eternal truth and beauty.

God bless you, and St. Theresa, pray for us!



### **Sponsor Certificates**

Please contact the Parish Office to obtain a sponsor certificate prior to a Baptism or Confirmation.

### **Baptisms**

Parents desiring Baptism for their child must attend a class (preferably before the child's birth) held the first Thursday of each month at **7pm (note the** time change) in a Conference Room in the Administration Bldg. You may schedule your child for the Sacrament of Baptism (held all Sundays 1:30pm) by visiting the Parish website under Faith, Sacraments, Baptism. Date is confirmed once all paperwork is received in the office (at least 2 weeks prior to the date of desired Baptism.)

### Matrimony

The priest must be contacted at least six (6) months prior to the wedding date.

Visit the Parish Website under Faith, Sacraments, Marriage and fill out the Marriage Preparation Questionnaire prior to contacting the Parish Office. A priest will contact you.

### RCIA

Adults desiring instruction in the Catholic Faith should visit the website to register for RCIA classes.


