Feelings vs. Faith

There's a spiritual war being waged within the private thoughts of many, many people. All day long, they repeat to themselves an endless litany of toxic, depressing, self-detrimental thoughts. Such thoughts are not from God, and can cause us much harm. It's easy to turn such thoughts into doubts about God's goodness towards you. Since our chosen thoughts become the seedbed of our words and actions, it's very important that we choose not to allow our minds to sulk into poisoned thinking.

Many people assume such thoughts are a struggle with faith. In reality, they are only struggling with their feelings. Don't let your feelings tell your mind what to think. Control your thoughts. Lead with deliberate faith.

- When feelings say "all is hopeless," faith must say, "hope cannot be killed, because Jesus rose from the dead."
- When feelings say, "I'm worthless," faith must say, "Jesus suffered and died for me, as though I were the only person in the world."
- When feelings say, "my life can't be repaired," faith must say, "God is so powerful that he can bring good out of absolutely anything."
- When feelings say, "I can't keep going," faith must say, "I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me."
- When feelings say, "I am in darkness," faith must say, "no one who follows Christ ever walks in darkness, because he is the light of life."

Rarely does a pessimist ever describe himself as a pessimist. A pessimist rather, usually calls himself a "realist," who doesn't want to give into "wishful thinking." But nothing is more "real" than God, and the Good News of our faith is based not on wishful thinking, but on God's demonstrated goodness throughout the history of salvation. That's why deliberate thoughts of faith have power that no other thoughts have. They have the power to stop toxic thoughts from taking root in our lives.


When you're feeling down, be proactive. Take charge. Put faith at the wheel, and tell your emotions to take the back seat. Feelings will oppress you. Faith gives you relief. Feelings pull you down. Faith lifts you up. Feelings lead to despair. Faith gives confidence and purpose. All our lives long, we've trained ourselves to allow unchecked feelings to rule our thoughts. Decide now to counter those feelings with thoughts of faith.

Every soul is a battlefield, and we will fight to our dying breath. In every spiritual struggle, we are not passive spectators but active participants. Choose to form your mind with deliberate statements of faith. The blessings will be clear not only to you, but to everyone who knows you.

Four Principles of Catholic Social Teaching*

The central and enduring themes of Catholic social teaching are organized under four principles that provide a moral framework for decisions in public life.

The Dignity of the Human Person

Human life is sacred. The dignity of the human person is the foundation of a moral vision for society. Direct attacks



on innocent persons are never morally acceptable. In our society, the gravest example is abortion. Euthanasia, assisted suicide, human cloning, in vitro fertilization

and the destruction of embryos for research are others. Protecting the dignity of life also includes overcoming poverty, ending use of the death penalty, and opposing racism, torture, unjust war, human trafficking and all activities that contribute to the "throwaway culture" identified by Pope Francis.

The Common Good

The common good is achieved when social conditions allow people to reach their fulfillment more fully and easily. It



upholds the fundamental right to life, which makes all other rights possible. It asserts the right to food, shelter, education, employment, health care, housing, freedom

of religion and conscience, and family life. It requires an economy that serves people, not the other way around. It calls on employers to uphold the dignity and rights of workers by offering productive work, decent and just wages, adequate security in their old age, the choice of whether to organize and join unions and the opportunity for legal status for immigrant workers. Workers should contribute a fair day's work for a fair day's pay, treat employers and co-workers with respect and contribute to the common good. This principle requires we protect and care for all of God's creation, especially the most vulnerable among us, and the earth, our common home.

Subsidiarity

The human person is social. The family is the fundamental building block of society, based on marriage between a man



and a woman, a sanctuary for creation and nurturing of children. Policies and programs should defend, strengthen and respect this foundational unit and uphold parents'

rights and responsibilities to care for and educate their children. Further, every person and association has a right and duty to actively shape society and promote the well-being of all, especially the poor and vulnerable. Subsidiarity means that society's larger institutions should not overwhelm or interfere with smaller or local ones. These larger institutions are obliged, however, to protect human dignity and meet human needs when smaller institutions cannot adequately do so.

Solidarity

We are one human family, despite our national, racial, ethnic, economic and ideological differences, called to love our neighbor as ourselves. We must work to



eradicate poverty, disease and racism; and welcome immigrants, refugees and asylum seekers who are seeking employment, safety, education and

a better life for their families. Solidarity requires preferential concern for the poor. A basic moral test of any society is how it treats those who are most vulnerable. This preferential option for the poor and vulnerable includes all who are marginalized – unborn children, persons with disabilities, the elderly and terminally ill, victims of injustice and oppression and immigrants.

Sacraments

Sponsor Certificates

Please contact the Parish Office to obtain a sponsor certificate prior to a Baptism or Confirmation.

Baptisms

Parents desiring Baptism for their child must attend a class (preferably before the child's birth) held the first Thursday of each month at 7pm (note the time change) in a Conference Room in the Administration Bldg. You may schedule your child for the Sacrament of Baptism (held all Sundays 1:30pm) by visiting the Parish website under Faith, Sacraments, Baptism. Date is confirmed once all paperwork is received in the office (at least 2 weeks prior to the date of desired Baptism.)

Matrimony

The priest must be contacted at least six (6) months prior to the wedding date.

RCIA

This month is the 20 year anniversary of Divine Mercy Outreach! (Sept 27th) It has been a privilege and an honor to be able to serve those in need and work with all of you to assist those in need.

It is bittersweet to announce that I am resigning as outreach director in October. Due to family reasons, we are relocating to out of state. 


