Getting the Most Out of Confession

Every sacrament offers the infinitude of God's grace to your soul, but not every person who receives a sacrament receives the same amount of grace. If we receive a sacrament in a distracted, half-hearted manner, we limit its effectiveness. If we receive a sacrament devoutly, God accomplishes more in us. Every worthy confession forgives sin, but the transformative grace we receive depends on our own disposition. That's why it's important that we confess as best we are able. To make a good confession, you must mention every serious (mortal) sin by name and also mention the number of times you committed the sin. The confession of lesser (venial) sins is helpful too, so long as you focus on the sins you struggle with, rather than simply listing every sin that comes casually to mind. The most important qualities to bring to confession however, are contrition and sincerity. To that end, here's just a few practices to make confession more fruitful.

Don't Confess Other People's Sins: Confession is a place to tell the priest what you are sorry for doing, but it's surprisingly common for people to confess not their own sins, but the sins of others! "My friend was unkind to me [insert story here], so I was unkind to him in return." "My husband's problem is [insert fault here], and he makes me lose my patience." Blaming others for your sins is a not-so-subtle way of deflecting blame from yourself. That's the very opposite of a good confession. Confession is a unique moment to focus on your own sins. Make the most of it. Don't ever mention the faults of others.

Emotions Are Not Sins: You may "feel" any emotion at all—sadness, frustration, hurt, disappointment—but please remember that emotions are never sins. This is because a sin, by definition, must always be a free choice. A "sin" is a thought, word, action, or even a desire that is contrary to God's will. But before anything can be a sin, it must be a free choice. A feeling is never a choice. Feelings are like weather—they arrive uninvited, and take up lodging in our minds, often against our free will. Feelings and emotions do play a role in our moral life. Namely, they can make an action more or less praiseworthy, or more or less blameworthy. (For example, if I feel sad, but deliberately choose to be cheerful smile, that's praiseworthy! If I feel very gloomy, and then suddenly utter an unkind word, it's less blameworthy. It's a bit more understandable. But in neither case is the "feeling of sadness" itself a sin.) You'd be amazed how many people think they are guilty before God for their emotional state. Don't confess your emotions. You're never guilty for how you feel.

Don't Bury the Lede: From time to time, people will confess a list of lesser offenses, then casually slip a serious sin in the middle of the list. (Maybe they think the priest won't notice?) Confession is never easy, and there's always one or two sins that you're most embarrassed to mention. But it's important to remember that confession is a place to heal a wounded relationship with God. So, behave in confession as you would when apologizing to a friend of family member. Not all sins are equal. If there's something big you need to apologize for—say that part first.

Don't Be Vague: Call a sin by its name. You'd be amazed how easy it is to gloss over a sin, and how often it happens. For example, if I stole lunch money from a classmate at school, it's not sufficient to say "I was mean to a classmate." If I committed adultery multiple times in an extended extramarital relationship, it's not enough to say, "I struggled with lust." Most people have a hard time confessing sexual sins. Here's a helpful metric—always tell the priest if a sin of unchastity took place in your mind, alone, or with another person. No priest needs every detail, or a play-by-play analysis, but if you're deliberately vague, you're no longer confessing sin at all. Call your sin by its name, clearly and directly. Then move on. And with that in mind...

Avoid the Word "Inappropriate": Don't say the word "inappropriate" in confession. "Inappropriate" is a word so overused that not only has it become clichéd, it has nearly lost its meaning entirely. The word "inappropriate" literally means "lacking in propriety," and since our society has no agreement as to what is "proper," this word does not communicate very much. Instead of saying your actions were "inappropriate," choose a more specific word. For example, "my actions were unkind," "impure," "mean-spirited," "unchaste," or "uncharitable." Any of these words is better than "inappropriate." Whenever we tell another person we are sorry for what we've done, we try be as specific as we can. This is certainly true for asking God's pardon in confession, as well.

This is certainly not an exhaustive list, but I hope it leads to a more fruitful reception of the grace of this sacrament.





Proposed Constitutional Amendments: Be Vigilant!



Proposed Amendments to Virginia's Constitution would:



Create a radical "fundamental right" to abortion (Opposed by VCC)



Remove Virginia's "union between one man and one woman" definition of marriage (Opposed by VCC)



Restore voting rights (Supported by VCC)

These three proposals were **initially approved** by the General Assembly earlier this year. If they pass the legislature again in 2026 – and are then approved by Virginia voters on a ballot – they would become law.

The legislators we elect this November will decide whether the proposed amendments are advanced or stopped.

Extreme, Radical and Deadly Abortion Amendment

This proposed amendment would enshrine virtually unlimited abortion at any stage of pregnancy as a "fundamental right" in Virginia's constitution.

In addition to the paramount problem of not recognizing the child's life, the amendment:

- · Does not include any age restriction
- Does not include any safety standards
- Jeopardizes Virginia's parental consent law
- Jeopardizes Virginia's conscience protections for healthcare providers
- Expands Virginia's already permissive abortion laws
- And has numerous other problems!

Abortion is a fundamental tragedy, not a "fundamental right".

Ending a life is not a right and does not belong in the constitution.

Amendment Rejecting the Truth about Marriage

This proposed amendment would remove Virginia's constitutional definition of marriage as the "union between one man and one woman." It would add language recognizing "any lawful marriage between two adult persons" instead.

Marriage was created by God as the union of a man and a woman. God's design and purpose for marriage existed before any nation, religion or law.

The family – based on marriage between a man and a woman – is the fundamental unit of society and is integral to the common good.

Marriage – as created by God – is essential to the common good. Each of us is called to preserve God's design.



Amendment Restoring Voting Rights

This proposed amendment would restore voting rights to all people who have completed their prison sentences.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church reminds us, "It is necessary that all participate...in promoting the common good. This obligation is inherent in the dignity of the human person.... As far as possible, citizens should take an active part in public life" (nos. 1913-1915).

Enabling individuals, upon release, to resume taking an active part in voting decisions affirms their dignity and provides them a second chance to fulfill their duty to participate in promoting the common good. It enables them to have a say in decisions that affect them, their families and their communities.

As the U.S. Catholic Bishops have noted, restoring voting rights is an important aspect of reintegration:

"[W]e must welcome ex-offenders back into society as full participating members, to the extent feasible, and support their right to vote."

Sponsor Certificates


