Things Jesus Never Said

There are certain ideas we hear so often in Christian parlance that we begin to believe they're true. But a lie repeated often is still a lie, and just because something sounds spiritual doesn't mean Jesus ever said it. If we want to be faithful disciples of Christ, we need to be formed not by what people imagine Jesus said, but by Christ's actual words. With that in mind, here are four things Jesus never said, but that many Christians still believe:

"Come follow me, and your troubles will be over!"

The one who wore a crown of thorns never promised us a garden of roses. Jesus never said that comfort and ease await those who believe in him. Remember Jesus actual words: "If anyone wants to follow me, let him deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me" (Mt 16:24). The cross was not a symbol of prosperity. It was not a symbol of comfort. It was quite literally a symbol of death. Jesus actual words promise not comfort, but hardship. "In this world, you will have trouble. But be of good cheer, because I have overcome the world" (Jn 16:33). Remember this when life is hard. It does not mean God has abandoned you. It might mean you're exactly where you are supposed to be. Because as Pope Benedict XVI once said, "you were not made for comfort. You were made for greatness."

"Just be a good person."

We hear this a lot. "It doesn't matter what you believe. Just be a good person." But Jesus never said, "just be a good person." He never said we just need to improve ourselves. He said, rather, that we need an entirely new life. Remember the story of Nicodemus in the Gospel of John? Nicodemus was one of the most important religious leaders of his time, and certainly a "good person," but Jesus told him, "You will not see the kingdom of God unless you are born again" (Jn 3:3). No one goes to heaven for being nice. We do not earn our own salvation, or forgive ourselves of sin. We are saved from the deathly grip of sin by grace, won for us by the blood of the Lamb. "We have all become like something unclean. All our just deeds are like polluted rags. Our crimes carry us away like the wind" (Is 64:5). Even our best efforts can't wipe clean the record of our offenses. So, don't trust in your own righteousness. Believe rather in God's mercy.

"If you have enough faith, nothing bad will happen."

G.K. Chesterton once quipped, "Jesus promised his disciples three things: that they would be completely fearless, absurdly happy, and constantly in trouble." And yet so many people believe that (somehow) faith should protect us from trouble. Jesus never said faith would keep us out of trouble. He said rather that the winds would blow, the storms would come, and that the rain would fall "both on the righteous and the wicked alike" (Mt 5:45). Faith doesn't stop the storm. Faith anchors you in the middle of it. Do you remember the story of the apostles, in the storm on the sea? A storm suddenly welled up on the Sea of Galilee while Jesus himself was in the boat with them. The winds howled, the waves crashed, and the apostles feared that the boat would be swamped. But the ship did not sink. Jesus was with them. God never promised a storm-free life. He promised he'd be with us in the storm. We must learn to understand—that's all we need.

"I will love you—when you get your act together!"

God doesn't love you because you're good. God loves you because he's good. And yet most Christians live their entire lives believing that God does not love them at all. They believe rather, that God is deeply disappointed in them, that he's tired of waiting for them to change, and that he will love them when they finally "get their act together." But Jesus never said, "I will love you when you get your act together." He said, "I came to seek and save the lost" (Lk 19:10). St. Paul told us, "It was in this that God proved his love for us—that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us" (Rom 5:8). He didn't love us after we repented. He didn't love us after we believed. He loved us while we were totally lost, and could not find the way to him. God doesn't love some future version of you. He loves the real you, right now—even in the middle of your mess. (He loves you too much to leave you there, by the way. God is always calling us to deeper repentance and conversion.) But this does mean God's love isn't something you earn. Rather, it's something you receive.

Let's stop believing in things Jesus never said, and start living by the things he actually did say. The truth might not always sound comforting, but it will always set you free.

God bless you...and St. Theresa, pray for us!




