Why Can't Protestants Receive Communion?

In a recent hospital visit, someone asked me, "Why can't Protestants receive Communion in the Catholic Church?" It's always one of the most awkward and painful moments for any priest to face. Because even when you try to explain why the Eucharist is reserved to Baptized Catholics in a state of grace, it can SEEM like you're telling them, "Because non-Catholics aren't good enough." Is that the message of our faith? Is that what the Church believes? Let's take a closer look.

From the very beginnings of our faith—even its first decades—the Eucharist was restricted to those fully initiated into the Church. In fact, not only did non-Christians not receive Communion, they were escorted out of Mass at the conclusion of the readings! This is because we have always believed that the Eucharist is an expression of full membership in the Church. It's not merely a personal prayer, or an act of devotion, or even a statement that you believe in Christ's body and blood. According to the Catechism: "Through the Eucharist, Christ unites the faithful into one body—the Church. Communion renews, strengthens, and deepens this incorporation into the Church, already achieved by Baptism" (CCC, 1396). That is to say, we believe the Eucharist actually unites those who share the same faith. This of course requires first that those who receive Communion should first actually profess the same faith.

Although various Christian denominations profess many beliefs in common, (the divinity of Christ, the inspiration of scripture, the necessity of Baptism) it would be false to assume all Christians profess the same faith. Divisions in Christianity are sad, but they are real. If "receiving the Eucharist" means "full membership in the Church," then the divisions in Christianity prevent many Christians from receiving the Eucharist. This is why the Eucharist is restricted, and not open to anyone who approaches.

Perhaps a parallel case would help illuminate our belief: Catholics should not take communion at Protestant services either. As the Code of Canon Law states, "Catholic ministers may licitly administer the sacraments to Catholic members of the Christian faithful only and, likewise, the latter may licitly receive the sacraments only from Catholic ministers" (CIC 844). In our understanding, "taking communion" has always meant "full membership." We are not full members of Protestant denominations, and so we should not take communion at their services. Furthermore, those who are not baptized (Jews, Muslims, Hindus, etc.) should not receive the Eucharist either. While we welcome them to join us in prayer, we cannot invite them to receive the sacraments, since the sacraments are intrinsically linked to belief in Christ and membership in the Church.

The Eucharist is all about communion, which is why we also call the Eucharist, "Communion." Not only about communion with Jesus' Real Presence, but about communion with the Church, which is the Body of Christ on earth. Ironically, "open communion" actually negates the very idea of communion itself. If all receive the host regardless of personal beliefs, spiritual state, or church membership, then the Eucharist ceases to be a sign of communion with anything at all. It becomes an empty ritual. When beliefs among churches differ, it's clear that you can't be in full communion with more than one church.

Although there are some specific danger-of-death circumstances in which the Church has permitted the Eucharist to non-Catholics, these are complicated beyond the scope of one single bulletin column! Let's pray that the divisions in Christianity could be healed, that wrongs from centuries past could be forgiven, and that all may be one in Christ, just as He prayed that we would be.

Gospel Meditation-Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

October 26, 2025 Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time Luke 18:9-14

Every now and then readers of these reflections write letters in which they object to something. Years ago, this Gospel of Luke 18 prompted such an email. A man wrote to me: "I find it deeply offensive that you suggest we are still sinners once we are God's sons and daughters." His objection stirred in me a profound awareness of the paradox at the heart of our faith. Are we sinners or beloved children of God?

In this Gospel (Luke 18:9-14), a tax collector appears as one who has missed the mark. His sins have isolated him. His breast-beating is not an act of self-flagellation for pride's sake but a heartfelt admission of his failure and unworthiness. Remarkably. Jesus honors the candid humility of the parable's penitent. Why? Because we are always in need of mercy, always. But even more, perhaps because on the cross, Jesus will fully embrace a similar place of humiliation and rejection. He will enter into the most shameful, offensive place of the sinner so that we might "go home justified."

There is a sacred tension in admitting that we are sinners and yet have profound hope. We are beloved sons and daughters of God, growing precisely through our honest acceptance of failure. When we cry, "Have mercy on us," during Mass or when we repeat the "Jesus Prayer" in quiet moments, or in the confessional, we embrace our imperfections as fertile ground for divine grace. In doing so, we follow Christ's example — finding true exaltation in the humble acknowledgment of our human frailty.






